ELECTIONS

On June 7th, the Governor, Senate, and House announced that there will be changes to the municipal elections dates to accommodate the special election to fill the vacancy in the 2nd Congressional District.

The changes apply to all municipal elections, not only those municipalities in the 2nd Congressional District.

We have received submissions from two individuals in Leeds: Jodi McGregor and incumbent Kohl Furley. Congratulations to them on their candidacy! Please be informed that the deadline for any write-in candidate filings is September 3, 2023, at 5:00 PM.

Since only two candidates applied for two open seats, the town will seek to pass a resolution to cancel the Leeds primary. The special election process for the 2nd Congressional District will involve a primary; however, and thus residents of Leeds will be participating in that.

Mayor's Message

Greetings!

Well, you've probably heard by now that I am running for Chris Stewart's US Congressional seat, which he was forced to resign from, due to his wife's health issues.

The choice did not come easy. Since becoming Mayor, I've come to realize the serious, aggressive threats against our next generation; economic, morally, and constitutionally. I have voluntarily been involved on multiple levels to help fight in protecting children from mature content, manage budgets in Leeds and our Fire District, as well as, writing legislation to preserve true constitutional rights.

As such, I was prompted and highly encouraged to declare candidacy for US Congress, when Stewart's seat came available. If I win or lose, is not my concern. I'll always do my best. I do know things happen for a reason and I'm going to follow that path - similarly to when I chose to run for Mayor.

I love Leeds, I love the people of Leeds, and I believe that Southern Utah absolutely needs representation in the US Congress from the State of Utah. Our Federal Lands, our access to Federal Funding, our preservation of the Constitutional right for States' functionality, and the essential representation of rural community's rights, must be represented by someone who lives in the District and Southern Utah.

A special congressional election will occur on Sep. 5, 2023; and a general special election on Nov. 21, 2023. If I am elected to Congress, an appointment for Mayor will be presented to the Town Council.

Business in Leeds has been fantastic. We're about to confirm our budget, which is looking amazing - we waited out the astronomical price gouging during covid and can now spend funds on projects with more affordable prices.

As some of you have seen, we are getting Oak Grove chip seal replaced, at no cost to the town. The County Commissioners agreed to provide this to the town of Leeds, since we house their Museum in Silver Reef.

The Main Street water line project with the Washington Water Conservancy District will begin soon. The Conservancy has donated the abandoned line to the town to utilize in mitigating flood waters along Main Street. The town has been diligently working with UDOT and Rasmusen Engineering to execute this project, which the funding is already secured.

Our efforts to address the flooding issues along Valley Road are also underway. Councilman Furley has secured bids from contractors working with Washington City, to provide competitive pricing and a timeline to complete the project.

Thank you for your continued support, volunteerism, input, guidance and kindness.
